We bring you greetings from the Center for Family and Child Enrichment, Inc. We are in our 44th year of providing behavioral health, child welfare, youth development, and primary prevention services to the children and families of Miami-Dade County. In addition, for the last eight years, we have operated a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), bringing primary health care services to the residents of North Dade County. Our services extend throughout Miami-Dade County and we provide services to children, adolescents, and adults.

Presently, our communities are in the midst of crisis and turmoil due to an insidious disease that is afflicting our families and children. It is difficult to measure the future impact that the COVID-19 and its life altering effects will have on our children, families, and seniors. One thing is certain: CFCE will be here to assist with the burden of managing your physical, mental, social and emotional well-being as we struggle to survive. While we may have reduced hours of operation, our doors will not close! We will utilize whatever means necessary to reach out to and care for our community. We expect that this storm will be with us for a while, but eventually will pass.

In July, we will offer a second year of our fabulous Freedom School summer camp, this year, virtually. We hope to have an “open air” end of program celebration in our parking lot, so that parents can come and partake in the rich cultural experience upon which Freedom School is based. The Freedom School is a program of the Children’s Defense Fund, founded by legendary civil rights lawyer and activist, Marian Wright Edelman. It is a literacy program which teaches children the value of reading through a lens of cultural heritage, self motivation and direction, and social activism. Over 130 “Freedom Schools” are in operation in 24 States across the country serving nearly 12,000 children. We are truly proud to be one.





COMMUNITY BASED YOUTH INTERVENTION

CINS/FINS

(Children in Need of Services/Parents in Need of Services)

The program is designed to help families whose youth exhibit risk factors that make them more susceptible to becoming involved with the juvenile delinquency system.

Domestic Violence Respite

This program serves as an alternative to secure detention for youth who are arrested and charged with a domestic violence offense on a household member.

S.N.A.P. Program

(Stop Now and Plan)

SNAP is an evidence-based cognitive behavioral model that provides a framework for teaching parents, and children ages 6-11, how to better manage behavior issues.

Many of the families received their services virtually during the COVID-19 pandemic. Program events included: a Back to School book bag drive-thru, Thanksgiving turkey box giveaway and a Christmas Toy drive.


