### **A Tribute by Ms. Delores Dunn, CFCE President /CEO**

Mr. James Hazel, an ordained minister at United Family Baptist Church, joined the Center for Family and Child Enrichment (CFCE), as a clinical on-site therapist for teenage boys, in 1995. Later, he became the program director for CFCE's children's day treatment program, which he led until it closed in 2000. In subsequent years, he continued his work with children in a variety of agency programs, including clinical outpatient therapy and as a prevention specialist with Too Good for Drugs. His last position is that of Outreach Coordinator for our Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC).

In this role, he developed and implemented a number of innovative

programs, such as the Quarterly Pastor's Luncheon, Men's Health Symposium, and Health Center Farm Share Food Give-a-Way, to name a few. Mr. Hazel contributed greatly to the success of CFCE and the well-being of its clients. In addition to his professional duties with the Agency, he was always willing to give the invocation at our programs and blessings for our special occasion meals. We are all so much better for having known and worked with him. We at CFCE mourn his passing but rejoice in his legacy of kindness, generosity, integrity and his long career of healing broken families and helping children grow to their full potential.

Lona was a consummate Networking Promoter and Entrepreneur where she used her professional knowledge to advise and connect businesses as well as build her dream business as a bed and breakfast host. She had
