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CFCE Freedom School – Summer 2021

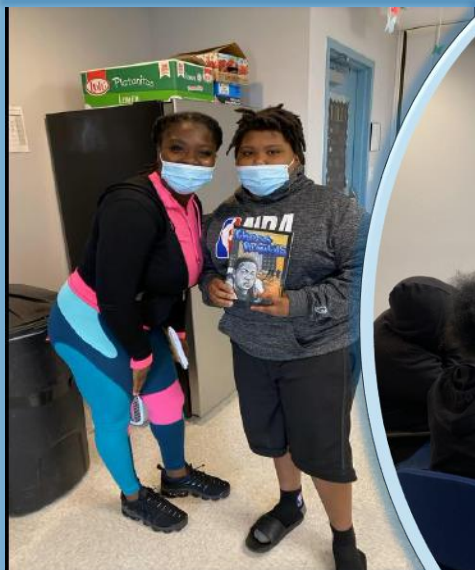


Freedom School is a research-based, multicultural program model that was developed by the Children's Defense Fund. The program provides summer and after-school enrichment that supports K-12 scholars and their families through five essential components: high quality academic and character-building enrichment; parent and family involvement; civic engagement and social action; intergenerational servant leadership development; and nutrition, health and mental health.

Freedom School scholars begin each day with "Harambee", a Kiswahili term that means "pull together". During Harambee, our scholars sing inspirational songs and recite motivational chants. We invite positive role models from the community into the Harambee experience to read aloud to the scholars from books in the Freedom School "library".

Freedom School relies on an intergenerational leadership model, so the program is staffed primarily by college students and recent college graduates with a 10:1 child to adult ratio. As a result, many children and youth make significant gains in reading achievement and don't experience any summer learning loss. For more information, email Susan Frazier at: sfrazier@cfceinc.org.

CFCE Launches Foster Parent Recruitment Campaign with Citrus Family Care Network

WHAT'S YOUR SUPERPOWER?

In an effort to address the extreme need for foster homes in the Northern Regions of Miami-Dade County principally Miami Gardens, Opa Locka, and surrounding areas, the Center for Family and Child Enrichment has joined with Citrus Family Care Network to launch a massive recruitment drive in an effort to find homes for children in foster care.

The shortage of a sufficient number of homes for children in these areas has led to children being placed outside of their communities and far away from their support systems. Visitation suffers as children may be placed twenty or thirty miles away from biological parents who lack transportation.

Foster care is often meant to be a temporary solution for children whose parents may require assistance to address issues that will assist them in regaining custody of their children. It is therefore of critical importance that the children are well cared for and nurtured so that one day they will be able to return to parents or find a permanent home.

The Center is reaching out to local churches to ask that they adopt this cause as a part of their mission. A small group of pastors is invited to serve as a steering committee and will work with CFCE and Citrus' Foster Parent recruitment staff to develop a work plan.
